

## SVRA EAST SPRINT CHAMPIONSHIP Series Scoring System

January 1, 2015

**1.**SVRA EAST events that have SVRA Sprint Series Races:

**Road Atlanta Southern Classic** Sebring VintageClassic Homestead-Miami Historics **Road America Spring Festival** Invitational Events are not part of the Series Championship

**Mid-Ohio Vintage Grand Prix Pocono Mountains Vintage Challenge U.S. Vintage Grand Prix at Watkins Glen** Heacock Gold Cup at V.I.R

2. Sprint Series points will be awarded to the driver and these points will be scored within each Class in each SVRA Race Group. Points from different Classes may not be combined. A driver may score points in any car at his disposal in so long as it is in compliance with all SVRA Rules and Regulations.

4. One (1) point will be awarded to competitors finishing 11th and below for being scored for at least the completion of the first lap of a race. NC or "Multi-Class" designated competitors are not podium eligible and WILL NOT score points.

5. Overall championship points are Race Group specific. A driver may score points in more than one Group but those points accumulate only in that Group for the Overall Sprint Series Championship. A driver must compete in a minimum of 3 SVRA events to be eligible for Sprint Championship Awards. "Compete" is defined as "taking the Green Flag and completing the first lap".

6. A driver that competes in the Sprint Race(s) must be a driver that qualified that specific car.

7. A "finisher" is a competitor who has completed 50% of the number of laps completed by the winner.

8. In order for a co-driver, or drivers that "share" the Sprint Races during an event, to score points, he/she must be listed on the Official Results Sheet. It is the entrant's responsibility to notify Timing & Scoring that this "sharing " is planned. It is also the entrant's responsibility to check and make sure results are correct prior to the conclusion of the event.

9. Drivers found at fault in an on track incident, in any session during the race weekend, including an enduro, may forfeit Sprint Championship points as deemed appropriate by the Competition Director.

10. Tie. In the event of a tie, the tie will be broken by (1) the driver with the greater number of higher placed finishes, (2) the driver who has competed against the greater number of cars in Class, (3) the driver who has competed in the most events.
